Take 3 steps to prepare to vote in the Presidential Primary

Wisconsin's Presidential Primary is April 7, 2020. The Presidential election is November 3, 2020. More information is at vote.wisc.edu.

1. Choose Where to Vote . . .

University students in Wisconsin can vote from ONE address: EITHER a campus address, OR a home address in Wisconsin or another state.

Vote from your campus address: Citizens may register to vote using their campus address, and then vote on Election Day at their assigned campus-area polling place.

Alternatively, vote from your home address: Citizens may register to vote from a home address (in Wisconsin or another state), and then vote by mailing an absentee ballot.

2. Register to Vote . . .

Other states: 37 states have online voter registration. In many states, registration closes 30 days before an election. (This is not the case in Wisconsin.)

Opportunities to register in Wisconsin:

Online: You can complete your registration online at MyVote.wi.gov until 20 days before an election, if you meet both of these criteria:

- You have a Wisconsin driver's license or Wisconsin Dept. of Transportation-issued ID
- Your address on file with the DOT is the same as your voting address.

On Campus: There will be convenient on-campus opportunities to register, conducted by fellow students. These events will be listed at go.wisc.edu/VoteEvents.

On Election Day: Voters may also register at their assigned polling place on Election Day.

3. Get an Acceptable ID . . .

Obtaining an acceptable voting ID for Wisconsin is a separate step from registering to vote.

Acceptable: Wisconsin driver license, Wisconsin Department of Transportation-issued ID, or a U.S. Passport. Or you can get a free student voting ID at the Wiscard office in Union South.

Not acceptable: The standard UW-Madison Wiscard, or an out-of-state driver license.
